A Vision Whose Time Has Come



A Vision Whose Time Has Come

Over the last several years, Dr. Kern Singh of Rush University Medical Center and Dr. Alpesh Patel of Loyola University Medical Center in Chicago, along with other spine surgeons, have hosted informal gatherings in the hopes of increasing partnership and awareness with like-minded surgeons of Indian origin from around the world in pursuit of ventures in India, including travelling fellowships, training, research, and mission trips. In 2011, they became familiar with other groups who shared their vision and interest in supporting these objectives. It made sense to unite their efforts.

In October 2011 a small reception was held by both groups at the NASS Annual Meeting in Chicago to propose the formation of Indo-American Spine Alliance (IASA). The response was overwhelmingly positive. Outreach to prominent spine surgeons in India to corroborate the mission and purpose of the organization had similar results.

In January 2012, IASA was registered in the state of Pennsylvania as a non-profit organization with the following mission: "To facilitate and promote collaborative interaction between spine professionals of Indian origin and other interested surgeons from India, America, and abroad; to improve surgical education, to further spine research, and to advance care for patients afflicted with spine ailments in India." Our vision is to be the preeminent source for open and transparent collaboration in research, education,

IASA is governed by a board of directors representing prominent spine surgeonas from both India and the U.S.

First Fellowship to be Awarded

This spring, the first candidate for an IASA fellowship will be chosen among the Indian surgeons currently participating in one of three ASSI fellowships. The recipient of the IASA fellowship will attend a two-week long program at Rush University Medical Center in Chicago, under the tutelage of Dr. Kern Singh, a founding member of IASA.

First Board of Directors Meeting in New Delhi

In February 2012, the first formal gathering of the IASA Board of Directors was held in New Delhi, in conjunction with the Association of Spine Surgeons of India Conference (ASSICON). The Board members discussed the organization's programs and its short term objectives, and provided staff with clear directives to create all necessary components supporting each of the activities.

The Board has directed the staff to initiate and support the following programs:

- 1. Visiting Surgeon Program Skilled surgeons to visit clinics to share and exchange scientific and clinical information.
- 2. Surgeon Fellowships Bi-lateral fellowship opportunities for surgeons to enhance their knowledge of the treatment of various spinal pathologies.
- 3. Humanitarian Programs Mission trips with an educational component to help patients in need of treatment.

- 4. Research support Grants in support of directed research as well as data compilation, interpretation, and publication for both long and short term studies.
- Educational Programs Programs of varying type, both bioskills and didactic, directed toward Indian surgeons interested in furthering their knowledge in the treatment of various spinal pathologies.

The next meeting of the Board will be held in May in Amsterdam, in conjunction with SpineWeek 2012.
